

**COMMISSION MINUTES**  
**March 26, 2012**

Minutes of the regularly scheduled meeting of the Sevier County Commissioners held this twenty-sixth day of March, 2012. Meeting commenced at 1:30 p.m. with Commissioners Gordon Topham, Gary Mason, and Garth 'Tooter' Ogden in the Commission Chambers of the Sevier County Administration Building, 250 North Main, Richfield, Utah. Clerk/Auditor Steven C. Wall, County Attorney Dale Eyre and Executive Administrator Malcolm Nash were also present.

**Minutes for March 12<sup>th</sup> approved:**

Commissioner Topham moved to approve the minutes of the March 12<sup>th</sup> Commission Meeting, second Commissioner Mason, unanimous.

**Commission business:**

Commissioner Ogden reviewed the correspondence he had received including a request from Panoramaland RC&D for their contribution of \$100 from the County for their program.

Commissioner Topham reported he had met with Representatives of UDOT and the Salt Lake Express. They are looking at establishing some type of bus service between Richfield and Salt Lake City. No further action was taken at this time.

Malcolm Nash reported he had met with Salina City Mayor Conrad Miller and an attorney that helps establish redevelopment areas, as they are looking at establishing a redevelopment area in the Salina Industrial Park to help provide funding and assistance, utilities, as well as drawing companies to the industrial park. Mr. Nash said he would keep the Commission informed on any activities there.

**Road Department to surplus 1999 dump truck:**

Road Superintendent Mark Rickenbach met with the Commissioners concerning a 1999 Peterbilt dump truck with a bed, snow plow, and sander. He is recommending that they surplus the dump truck and authorize him to sell it to Richfield City, as he is in the process of purchasing a new one. Discussion followed concerning the ability to help the communities in the County in upgrading their equipment. Mr. Rickenbach noted that the sale to Richfield City of the truck, snow plow, and sander would be approximately \$50,000. After discussion, Commissioner Mason moved to declare surplus the 1999 Peterbilt dump truck, plate number 70253EX, with the dump bed (asset number 2689), snow plow (asset number 2688), and the sander (asset number 2998), and authorize the sale to Richfield City for \$50,000, second Commissioner Topham, unanimous.

**Contracts for Fair entertainment approved:**

Paula Martin, Fair Director, reviewed with the Commissioners the contract with Circle J Rodeo for providing the livestock, etc. for the rodeo during the Fair, and reported that it would be a two-day event at a fee of \$8,600. After discussion, Commissioner Mason moved to approve the contract with Circle J Rodeo Inc., second Commissioner Topham, unanimous.

Ms. Martin then reviewed with the Commissioners the contract with Jason Hewlett Entertainment for the performance group Lokalgrown to perform during the fair at a fee of \$3,500. After discussion, Commissioner Mason moved to approve the contract with the Jason Hewlett Entertainment, second Commissioner Topham, unanimous.

Ms. Martin then reviewed a contract with Vince Morgan, Brigade FMX LLC for motocross performances during the fair at a fee of \$6,000. After discussion, Commissioner Mason moved to approve the contract with Vince Morgan, Brigade FMX, second Commissioner Topham, unanimous.

Ms. Martin then reported she also had an agreement with the Scales and Tales Utah that would be providing animals and reptiles during the Balloon Festival to come back and provide some entertainment during the Fair for three days at a fee of \$4,500. After discussion, Commissioner Topham moved to approve the contract with Scales and Tales Utah at a fee of \$4,500, second Commissioner Mason, unanimous.

**Addendum to Tyler Technologies contract approved:**

Assessor Amy Garren-Clark then reviewed with the Commissioners an addendum to the contract issued in 2005 with Tyler Technologies in converting the data to be used with the CAMA assessing program with the State. She indicated that the MCAT Board had agreed to pay the license interface with Tyler Technologies for the conversion, but the County would have the responsibility to pay the annual maintenance of \$2,430 and the data conversion of \$879. After discussion, Commissioner Topham moved to approve the addendum to the contract with Tyler Technologies, second Commissioner Mason, unanimous.

**Revised Memorandum of Understanding with Forestry Fire and State Lands signed:**

The Commission then reviewed a revised Memorandum of Understanding between the Utah Division of Forestry, Fire, and State Lands, and Sevier County in providing equipment and personnel in wildland fires, and reimbursement of those costs. The Commission noted that there were a few minor changes in the contract that had been previously approved. After discussion, Commissioner Mason moved to approve the revised Memorandum of Understanding between the UDFFS and Sevier County, second Commissioner Topham, unanimous.

**Public Hearing set for Spotlight Ordinance:**

The Commission then reviewed an ordinance on spotlighting for predator and nuisance animals. They discussed the ordinance with Sheriff Curtis, noting that most of it is from State Code. The Commission requested a few minor changes in the ordinance, and asked that it be scheduled for a public hearing on April 23, 2012, during their regular meeting. No further action was taken at this time.

**Claims approved:**

Claims for the month of February were reviewed and approved on a motion by Commissioner Topham, second Commissioner Mason, unanimous.
