

COMMISSION MINUTES

August 28, 2017

Minutes of the regularly scheduled meeting of the Sevier County Commissioners held this twenty-eighth day of August, 2017. Meeting commenced at 1:30 p.m. with Commissioners Garth 'Tooter' Ogden, Kenneth May and Ralph Brown in the Commission Chambers of the Sevier County Administration Building, 250 North Main, Richfield, Utah. Clerk/Auditor Steven C. Wall and Executive Administrator Malcolm Nash were also present.

Commission business:

Commissioner May reported he had attended a public hearing in Salina where they had discussed maintaining their own police force, or working with the County Sheriff. He stated that all of the residents that spoke at the meeting, preferred that Salina City keep and maintain their own police force. He said they may not pursue contracting with Sevier County for police services.

Minutes of August 15th Commission meeting approved:

Minutes of the August 14th Commission meeting were reviewed and approved on a motion by Commissioner May, second Commissioner Brown, unanimous.

Refund approved:

Assessor Amy Garren-Clark then recommended a refund of \$330.41 to the Richfield Rehab Center. This was due to a State Tax Commission audit on their personal property, where there were some mis-classifications found. After discussion, Commissioner Brown moved to approve the refund as recommended, second Commissioner May, unanimous.

Joint Use Agreement for Sevier Valley Center approved:

The Commission then reviewed and discussed a Joint Use Agreement for the Sevier Valley Center between Snow College, Sevier County, Sevier School District, and Richfield City to continue a joint use agreement between those entities to ensure that they all have representation on the Executive Board to assist the SVC Director in the management of the SVC. Commissioner May reported that he had been on that Board to assist the College and the Committee to ensure that the County and other entities continue to be represented in making the Sevier Valley Center an ongoing community center that continues to serve the community as well as the college. After discussion, Commissioner Brown moved to approve the agreement, noting that it would be approved now and signed once all of the other entities have approved it, second Commissioner May, unanimous.

JCI Billing Agreement approved:

Sheriff Curtis then reviewed with the Commissioner a new billing service agreement with JCI Billing Services, which would be a slight increase from the current billing agreement with them. He reported that they do good job of ambulance billing and collecting for our ambulance, and recommended approval of the agreement. After discussion, Commissioner May moved to approve the agreement between Sevier County and JCI Billing Services for ambulance billings, second Commissioner Brown, unanimous.

Flat Canyon Maintenance Agreement approved:

Commissioner Ogden then reviewed with the Commissioners the Flat Canyon Maintenance Agreement, noting that the work has been completed there, and the project to mitigate flooding damage from Flat Canyon would be between Sevier County, Richfield City, Sevier Valley Canal Company, and Richfield Irrigation Canal Company in providing funding and the other items needed to maintain flood mitigation costs resulting from Flat Canyon storm water damage. The agreement would be for future maintenance. Commissioner Ogden also indicated that the Utah Department of Transportation would participate, but

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could not be a part of the agreement, but have pledged their continued support. After discussion, Commissioner May moved to approve the Flat Canyon Maintenance Agreement, second Commissioner Brown, unanimous.

There being no further comments to come before the Board, meeting adjourned at 2:05 p.m.
